
Welcome to the 2013 MMHA and the Markham Waxer Hockey Club AGM.

2012-13 Season Highlights

- Our two major events celebrating our players and the game of hockey continue to thrive. We hosted over 750 players, coaches and other volunteers at the 4th annual Player's Banquet which included for the first time a Battle of the Bands that was received enthusiastically by the all in attendance! The 3rd Annual MMHA Celebrates Hockey festival was another success with a focus on reaching out to those in the community not familiar with the game of ice hockey and a chance to buy used equipment at very affordable prices.
- We are into year two of the Markham Floorball league which is growing in participation and has now moved to the new Cornell Community Centre.
- The Saturday morning clinics for House League and Rep players continue to evolve with new instructors being added to meet the demand.
- The coach mentorship program continued with a greater focus on the younger age groups.
- Mt. Joy arena renovations are soon to be completed in time for the upcoming season including a new ice plant and boards.
- We completed the transition to the white helmets for our Rep players. All Current players are now outfitted.
- Our volunteer base has once again been key in delivering the programs we run
 throughout the season. A very special thank you to Jenn Bigioni who has stepped down
 from her role in Special Events & Communications. She will be missed but has
 mentored a good group of volunteers who will collectively carry on with this important
 role.

Treasurer's Report


We have once again engaged the services of Lott & Company Chartered Accountants to provide financial statements for the organization.

As of March 31, 2013 the MMHA House League account held approximately \$219,916 in cash. The year end fund balance is \$241,892, a decrease of \$30,554 from \$272,446 the previous year.

Revenues increased year over year, primarily due to increased registration. Expenses increased—the primary contributors are ice, a set of exhibition season jerseys, on-ice hockey development instructor fees, and floorball equipment purchases.

As of March 31, 2013, the Markham Waxers Rep account is holding approximately \$216,145 in cash. The year end fund balance is \$226,432 down from \$256,216 from the previous year.

Revenue increased year over year due to the increase in assessment fees to teams. Registration fees decreased as we had 12 fewer players in 2013 than 2012. Clinic revenue increased as we successfully ran more clinics. Ice rental costs increased as we were forced to purchase private ice for use by teams due to an inadequate ice allocation from the City of Markham. Clinic expenses rose, but were offset by clinic revenue. Tournaments and events expenses increased as the association took over the administration of the Waxers Early Bird Tournament and we hosted the OMHA Minor Peewee AAA Championship tournament. Tryout costs decreased in 2013, which reflects the one-time purchase of tryout jerseys in 2012. We paid the administrator, ice scheduler, chief referee, and timekeeper scheduler fees of \$25,000 which are included in administration. To offset the cost of switching to white helmets, the association offered teams rebates totalling \$9,975—this is the last year of the rebate program.



Thank you to the men and women who volunteered as coaches, trainers, and on-ice volunteers. We are very fortunate to have so many dedicated people take on these very important roles. Your dedication and devotion to creating a fun and safe environment for our children is appreciated.

Highlights of the Year

- 100% of our teams from Mite through Bantam were run by fully certified coaches and trainers.
- MMHA ran two eight-week sessions of Player Development clinics—one from October through December and one from January through March—at the cost of \$95 per session.
 We accommodated 116 house league players.
- Both the Tyke B and C teams were successful.
- A Fall and Winter newsletter was distributed to all members.
- MMHA hosted a Volunteer and Sponsor Appreciation Night where we honoured Elyse Floyd as Volunteer of the Year. We introduced our Long-Standing Coaches award by

MMHA Celebrates Hockey!

In August we held our third annual equipment swap benefitting our Yes, You Can Play fund. The swap provides an opportunity for families to purchase gently-used equipment at reduced prices and in time for the upcoming season. We were able to outfit many families with full equipment under \$70.

Floorball

In the spring of 2012, we introduced the game of floorball to our members by running a 9-week floorball league at Mt. Joy Community Centre. Floorball is a fast-paced, exciting, safe and low-cost type of co-ed indoor hockey. It resembles floor hockey or ball hockey but is played with light-weight, plastic composite sticks, a whiffle ball and rules that promote safety and skill.

Tony Roman Memorial Hockey Tournament

MMHA again took part in the annual Tony Roman Memorial Hockey Tournament (TRMHT)—the biggest house league tournament in the world! The TRMHT is a two-week tournament hosted annually by the City of Markham and run jointly by the City, the Thornhill Community Hockey League, Unionville Minor Hockey Association and the MMHA.

This year all teams enjoyed three round-robin games and several of our teams continued on to the playoff rounds.

VP/GM AA/A/AE Report

During the 2012-2013 season, 23 of 27 teams were iced. We continue to face challenges in the 1996, 1997 and 1998 age groups. We were able to ice two teams per division at the 1995-1996 and 1998 age groups. With the 1997 age group we were only able to ice a AA team. This will continue to be a challenge in the coming years. In the 1999 and younger age groups we have been successful in icing full AA/A/AE programs, but we are expecting a drop off in the 1999 age group for 2013-2014.

This was the first year for the York-Simcoe Minor Hockey League to adopt a new playoff format in which only the top four teams in each division/category qualified for the OMHA

Playdowns. This was a change from prior years where the top eight teams qualified. The purpose of this was to allow for a longer regular season, ending in late January as opposed to early January. It also allowed for a longer York-Simcoe playoffs, the purpose of which was to keep all teams playing meaningful games until the third week of February, as opposed to prior years when many teams were eliminated from both the OMHA's and the York-Simcoe's by the first week of February. Although it makes qualifying for the OMHA's more challenging, it makes for a longer overall season and a less condensed regular season schedule between September and January. The MMHA is in support of the new format. The OMHA will determine in the Spring of 2013 whether this format will be adopted on a permanent basis.

Although not successful in OMHA Playdowns, we were successful in the York-Simcoe Playoff Championships in 2012-2013 with the Novice AE and Minor Atom A teams both winning championship titles. The Atom AA, Minor Bantam AA and Minor Midget AA teams were all York-Simcoe finalists.

Hockey Development Report

The Hockey Development Program (HDP) operates and encompasses the Coach Mentorship Program and the Player Development Program. The mission of the HDP is to provide the support and resources necessary to aid in the successful development and continued learning of all of our coaches and players as members of the Markham Minor Hockey Association. The HDP runs under the direction of the HDP director, Michael Gouglas, appointed by the Markham Waxers Executive. The director oversees all aspects related to the program and communicates these operations to the Executive. The HDP consists of Coach Mentors, Instructors, and Volunteers.

The HDP works in partnership with the Ontario Minor Hockey Association and Hockey Canada. Whenever possible, the HDP uses resources and programs available through these governing bodies and executes them at the local level.

Highlights of the 2013/2014 Season

- For the first time we had a current NHL presence in Jay (San Jose Sharks) and Todd Woodcroft (LA Kings) at our coaching seminars. Jay was also a former Waxer.
- 89 House League Players registered for our Saturday morning HL clinics.
- 48 Rep Players registered for our FALL Saturday morning clinics.
- 80 Players registered for our Shooting & Scoring Specialty clinic.
- 61 Players registered for our Defence Specialty clinic.
- 38 Goalies registered for McGuire's Goaltending Training.
- Total of 316 players signed up for clinics.
- Feedback on the coaching seminars, coach mentorship program, and skill development programs was very positive again.

The Hockey Development program presented four Coach Seminars.

• In October, Ted Brown (University of Western Ontario), Terry Brown (Trenton), and Mike Pelino (Peterborough Petes) presented a seminar for all of our HL and REP coaches. This included an on-ice and off-ice session and last an entire morning. It was well attended and each coach received a drill package to take home



2012-2013 Season Highlights

- Markham supplied officials for 1,869 games during the 2012-2013 season.
- There were 834 house league games with teams from tyke to juvenile
- On the rep side, our officials worked in a total of 852 games.
- There were 795 regular season and playoff games.
- 57 exhibition games.
- Markham also covered 183 tournament games (Markham Early Bird & Whitby spring tournament)
- During the playoffs, 40 of our home games were officiated by "out of town" officials,
- Markham covered 91 "out of town" playoff game assignments for other OMHA centres.

Timekeeper Scheduler's Report

During the 2012-13 hockey season, timekeepers were provided for over 850 Waxer home games including playoffs and exhibition games and over 800 house league games (Peewee to Juvenile).

This season's roster was comprised of over 30 timekeepers, nine of which were new. All were asked to attend the closest OMHA timekeeper clinic, which was held in East Gwillimbury.

We expect to recruit additional new timekeepers for the upcoming season and are in contact with UMHA regarding the possibility of hosting a clinic in the fall for all timekeepers requiring certification.

Ice Scheduler's Report

During the 2012-2013 Hockey season, the Waxers and MMHA used a total of 156 hours of ice per week for the following:

- MMHA house league practices and games
- Waxers practices and games
- Development clinics
- Additional ice at CanLan was used
- Minimal Junior A ice was allocated to Waxers

The team ice allocation was balanced to address all team requests prior to the season starting and allowing AP players to be called up. During the year there was available ice to teams for extra practice or loss of practice due to playoff.

Tryout schedule booked for 2012-2013 season was a success and the use of Stouffville Ice and Angus Glen during the tryouts was a great help as well.
