

Welcome to the 2016 Markham Minor Hockey Association and Markham Waxers Hockey Club AGM.

I begin, as always, with a heartfelt thank you to our volunteer group who dedicate their time and effort towards running this organization for the benefit of our membership. We have a cohesive and interested group who continue to do their best for our hockey community!

2015-2016 Season Highlights

- This past season started slowly but ended up on a very strong note with many teams enjoying great success in the playoffs. Congratulations to all the players, coaches and bench staff! For the first time we experimented with having two entries in two of our age groups. Even though the teams faced challenges on a competitive basis, the feedback from the players and parent group as a whole was positive.
- Another highlight was the completion of the City of Markham's revamping of the ice allocation process. After five years of efforts working with the city staff and the other ice user groups, this issue was finalized with a new formula for calculating how each group is to receive their allocation of ice time. In the end, our association benefited with approximately 12 hours of additional ice per week throughout the season. A big thank you to Joe Quercia, Deb Larsen and Darren Mori for their extra effort in arranging a schedule to best distribute this new allocation of ice time!
- We continued our tradition of celebrating the players and recognizing their efforts
 through our annual Waxers and Rostered Select banquets and our Markham Waxers
 House League Championship Weekend. The annual Markham Waxers Equipment Swap
 was held at the Mount Joy Arena with special guest Steven Stamkos signing
 autographs. The event raised funds for families who cannot afford to have their kids
 play hockey.
- The Saturday clinics for house league and rep players continued to be popular for those
 players looking to advance their skills during the season. The pre-tryout clinics for both
 players and goalies were another great success and we will continue to look for ways to
 add to this kind of programming.
- The coach mentorship program continues to provide support for both first year coaches as well as those with previous experience looking to improve their skill set.

Treasurer's Report

Many thanks go to Deb Larsen, our administrator, for her diligent work keeping all of our books in excellent shape. We have once again engaged the services of Lott & Company Chartered Accountants to provide financial statements for the organization.

Markham Waxers House League

As of March 31, 2016 the Markham Waxers House League fund balance was \$146,019, a decrease of \$59,694 over the previous year.

Revenues were up \$7,343 in comparison with the previous season. The increase in registration and sponsorship revenue was offset by an increase in registration refunds and




a decrease in other income due to select teams purchasing their own ice contracts instead of being provided City of Markham ice from our ice allocation.

Expenses increased \$69,693 over the 2014-2015 season.

- Ice rental costs increased \$30,880 due to an increase in hours purchased and an increase of \$20/hour in ice fees. Extra ice was purchased to begin the season two weeks earlier, in mid-September, in order to get in a full season due to the timing of holidays during the season. The association also kept the ice on the first March Break weekend to run a house league 3-on-3 tournament, which was very well received.
- Administrators fees increased this year due to the timing of payments to our ice scheduler, referee-in-chief, and timekeeper scheduler for the 2014-2015 season (\$5,250) and the additional payment (\$4,000) to our ice scheduler due to his increased workload as a result of the York Simcoe Rostered Select loop.
- Association fees do not include a reconciliation with the UMHA for the midget and juvenile divisions and, as a result, increased \$6,886.
- Seminars and clinics fees increased \$10,426. We reimbursed a record number of our house league coaches and trainers this year, resulting in an increase in certification reimbursement costs of \$2,072. We ran a Coach 2 clinic at the cost of \$3,857, however this expense was offset in registration fees collected for the clinic. Fees for our house league coach and trainer clinic increased \$1,600 for guest speaker fees and printing costs.
- Banquets, trophies, and photos increased \$5,970. Our Championship Weekend included pizza for all divisions this year, including our ten Initiation teams, who, in the past, only received TimBits. We purchased rally towels for the Initiation and Tyke divisions for \$1,000. Due to the Markham Royals taking over space we previously used for free at Centennial, we had to rent the Bocce court meeting room for Championship Weekend for our Tyke and Atom divisions at a cost of \$450. We purchased additional ice for the Select Banquet for skills competitions at a cost of \$1,100.
- Events and fundraisers expense increased \$4,270 primarily as a result of changing venues for our Volunteer Appreciation Night. We have outgrown the Markham Vets Hall and held the evening at the Meadowbrook Golf Club. We also spent an additional \$837 in room rental for house league meetings held throughout the year, including Rookie Camp and the annual equipment swap.

Registration fees have been increased for the 2016-2017 season by \$20/player.

Markham Waxers Rep

As of March 31, 2016 the Markham Waxers fund balance is \$300,408 an increase of \$90,196 from the previous year.


Revenue increased \$177,939 year over year. Team registrations and assessments increased due to an increase in assessment fees of \$1,000/team and an additional three teams over the 2014-2015 season. Registration fees were increased from \$500 to \$1,000 per player and assessment fees were reduced a comparable amount so that the association could issue registration fee tax receipts for the Child Fitness Tax Credit.

Expenses increased \$72,065 over the 2014-2015 season.

- The majority of the increase (\$63,000) was in ice rental costs, which increased due to a 1% increase in the cost of the City of Markham ice and a 30% increase in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville ice. We continue to purchase additional ice from Canlan Ice Sports (\$67,890) and The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville (\$33,372) in order to run our program. The additional hours purchased for sale to house league also contributed to the increase.
- Concussion testing expenses increased (\$8,080) due to three additional teams. There
 was also an issue with Konkussion Inc. invoicing us for 2014-2015 players tested in
 the fall of 2014 at the same time they invoiced us for the testing of our 2015-2016
 players. This has been addressed and going forward we will be invoiced for players
 during the season in which they were tested.
- Tryout costs increased \$3,718 due to the purchase of additional tryout jerseys and the need for on-ice help for tryouts associated with the three additional teams.

We paid the administrator, ice scheduler, chief referee, and timekeeper scheduler fees of \$24,908, which are included in Administrators Fees.

Highlights of the Year

- One hundred percent of our teams from Mite through Bantam were run by fully certified coaches and trainers. MWHL is the only minor hockey association in the City of Markham to provide a certified trainer on every bench.
- MWHL ran a ten-week session of player development clinics—from October through January—at a cost of \$125 per session. We accommodated over 50 house league players.
- MWHL hosted a Volunteer and Sponsor Appreciation Night where we honoured Errol Misquitta as Volunteer of the Year.
- We recognize our long-standing coaches and trainers. This year we recognized Tom Hiscott, Derek Gorman, and Simon Crook as long-standing trainers. We had no longstanding head coaches this season.

VP/GM AA/A/AE Report

During the 2015-2016 season, twenty-five of a possible twenty-seven teams were iced. This was an increase from twenty-two teams iced during the 2014-2015 season. Additional teams were entered in the Atom (two AE teams) and Minor Atom (two A teams) divisions. This was a trial for the season. We saw that having two teams at the A level in Minor Atom was not successful as both teams struggled to remain competitive. As such the plan for 2016-2017 is to enter two AE teams at the Atom age group.

We continue to face challenges in the Minor Bantam to Midget age groups where only eight of twelve teams were iced. Across the York Simcoe Minor Hockey League (YSMHL) participation at the Midget age group continues to be a challenge. In 2016-2017 a 24-game schedule for Midget has been approved by the YSMHL to lessen the load for Midget aged players in an attempt to keep players in rep hockey at this age.

Once again we had good success at the AA category this season with the Peewee AA team reaching the OMHA Finals, where unfortunately they succumbed to Burlington in a 5-game series. York-Simcoe Championships were won by the Minor Atom, Minor Peewee and Minor Bantam AA teams and the Midget AA team was a finalist. At the A category the Novice A and Peewee A teams won York-Simcoe Championships. The Minor Peewee A was a finalist.




- Approximately 620 games played between exhibition, league, tournaments and playoffs
- The 9 teams combined for a 132-125-41 league record.
- Four teams were above the .500 level, 2 teams at the .500 level and three were below.
- Our Minor Atom team made it to their OMHA Championship weekend and came away victorious garnering the gold medal. They now are the hosts for the Atom AAA OMHA Championship weekend in March 2017.
- Paul Giallonardo, Head Coach of our Minor Atom team, was our AAA Coach of the Year. This was our second year accepting nominations from players and parents in this process and it worked well.
- We had two players selected from our Minor Midget team in the recent OHL Draft –
 Connor Gillanders and Tyler Davis. We have many graduating Midget players
 moving on to various levels of Junior Hockey.
- Our teams attended 41 tournaments spread across Ontario, Michigan, New York State and Quebec. Many lasting memories for players, families and teams.

Issues/ Ongoing Matters/ Work in Progress

- Striving to keep more Markham/Stouffville residents playing AAA hockey in our organization; this is an annual goal that we stress to our coaches.
- Working with coaches to improve/promote communication levels with players and families; coach surveys completed by Parents show we are improving some but still work to be done. A large component of this is managing the expectation level of parents. We are attempting to meet face to face with more teams/parents to discuss any issues.
- The two-year OHF mandated pilot project of freedom of movement at the Midget AAA level, started in the 2013-2014 season will continue for at least one more year.
- Coach Development; the mentor system and clinics are helping to improve the knowledge level and provide a valuable sounding board for all of our registered Coaches.
- A new High Performance HP1 program is mandatory for all head coaches in Minor Bantam and above. We will be able to meet this requirement

- Being a member of the LOR (Lake Ontario Region) and dealing with the ever changing rules/system does not get any easier. The OMHA and GTHL are trying to work together on improvements to the existing agreement.
- The costs of Minor Hockey for all members is an annual ongoing issue that must be considered in all decision making.
- The Hockey Development group are doing a good job with player and goalie clinics; these are helping with the player numbers at the younger age groups.
- The ETA has expanded the longer "period time" trials from Midget and Minor Midget to Bantam for the upcoming season.
- The four-person officiating pilot will include Bantam AAA along with Midget and Minor Midget for the 2016-2017 season.
- It appears that the electronic game sheet pilot conducted by the ETA for Midget/ Minor Midget and Bantam in the 2015-2016 season will move to all AAA levels for the 2016-2017 season.


Hockey Development Report

The Hockey Development Program (HDP) operates and encompasses the Coach Mentorship Program and the Player Development Program. The mission of the HDP is to provide the support and resources necessary to aid in the successful development and continued learning of all of our coaches and players as members of the Markham Minor Hockey Association. The HDP runs under the direction of the HDP director, Michael Gouglas, appointed by the Markham Waxers Executive. The director oversees all aspects related to the program and communicates these operations to the Executive. The HDP consists of coach mentors, instructors, and volunteers.

The HDP works in partnership with the Ontario Minor Hockey Association and Hockey Canada. Whenever possible, the HDP uses resources and programs available through these governing bodies executing them at the local level.

Highlights of the 2015-2016 Season

- 385 players registered for the player, goaltending and pre-tryout clinics.
- The Shooting, Defensive, and Pre-Tryout Clinic continue to be a huge draw for parents and players.
- Feedback on the coaching seminars, Coach Mentorship Program, and Player Skill Development programs was very positive once again.
- The OMHA has agreed to continue endorsing our coaching seminars with Professional Development Points under the new NCCP Coaching Requirements.
- We now have four coaches trained to certify D1 coaches within our association. Michael Gouglas, Darren Mori, Rob Binetti and Phil Kestin will all be able to certify coaches to meet the new NCCP requirements.
- With the NHL Draft being held in Buffalo. We will have a number of coaches attending the NHLCA Coaching Clinic on June 23.

The Hockey Development program presented three coach seminars.

- In October, Terry Brown (Trenton), Paul Legault and Jeff Flanagan presented a seminar for all of our House League and Rep coaches. This included an on-ice and off-ice session. It was well attended and each coach received a drill package to take home.

- In February James Boyd and Chris Dennis (York U) spoke to our House League and Rep coaches at Angus Glen Golf Club.

Head Trainer Report

The Markham Waxers organization once again mandated that all rep athletes participate in the Konkussion program. The cost for the program, \$50.00/player, was included in the team assessment fees. In support of the program, the organization sent out an educational newsletter covering the topics of concussion, baseline testing, and Return to Play protocol.

Ninety-eight percent of Waxers athletes participated in the program. There were two reasons given for opting out of the program: the athletes had already been baseline tested by their school (St. Andrew's College) and the parents did not think the organization should dictate where players should have their baseline testing completed.

The feedback regarding the program was very good. In general, parents commented that they were able to make more informed decisions regarding Return to Play after injury.
