

Welcome to the 2014 MMHA and the Markham Waxers Hockey Club AGM.

I begin as always with a heartfelt thank you to our volunteer group who dedicate their time and effort towards running this organization for the benefit of our membership. We have a cohesive and interested group who continue to do their best for our hockey community!

2013-14 Season Highlights

We continued our traditions of celebrating the players and recognizing their efforts through our annual MMHA House League banquet and the Waxers Rep banquet. For the first time we held a Rostered select banquet as the number of teams participating in this format continues to grow. The fourth annual MMHA Celebrates Hockey festival was held at the community centre in Cornell and again was successful at offering the used equipment sale and swap.

We were very fortunate to host the Central Region OHF Midget AAA championship put on by our own Waxers Midget AAA team who collectively did an amazing job which was appreciated by all participants.

Our Waxers rep teams enjoyed a high level of success this year with many teams achieving greater levels of success than in recent times.


The Saturday clinics for House League and Rep players continued to be popular for those players looking to advance their skills during the season. New this year were the pre-tryout clinics for both players and goalies, which sold out quickly.

The coach mentorship program continued to provide support for both first year coaches as well as those with previous experience but looking to learn how to improve their skill set.

We added a new volunteer position — Head Trainer, which was shared between Brian Sneek and Andrea Winarski. This position was created in part due to the interest in advancing both the awareness of AND returns to play protocol for concussions. Based on recommendations from the head trainers, the board voted to make baseline testing mandatory every year for all Waxers players. Thank you to Brian and Andrea for your efforts this year.

The board also voted to end our "joint venture" with the UMHA for the Midget and Juvenile HL programs. We will be running both these programs on our own with some exciting new features being added.

Treasurer's Report

We have once again engaged the services of Lott & Company Chartered Accountants to provide financial statements for the organization.


As of March 31, 2014 the MMHA House League account held \$144,015.97 in cash. The year end fund balance is \$203,057, a decrease of \$38,835 from \$241,892 the previous year.

Revenues increased year over year, primarily due to the expanded rostered select program and increased sponsorship. Expenses increased—the primary contributors are increased ice costs, additional ice for the rostered select program, and on-ice hockey development instructor fees.

As of March 31, 2013, the Markham Waxers Rep account is holding \$238,398 in cash. The year end fund balance is \$225,890 down \$542 from \$226,432 the previous year.

Revenue increased year over year due to the increase in assessment fees to teams. Registration fees decreased as we had fewer registered players in 2014 than 2013. Clinic revenue decreased. Ice rental costs decreased slightly as we had one less team. Tryout costs

increased but were offset by tryout revenue. We paid the administrator, ice scheduler, chief referee, and timekeeper scheduler fees of \$29,000 which are included in administration.



Thank you to the men and women who volunteered as coaches, trainers, and on-ice volunteers. We are very fortunate to have so many dedicated people take on these very important roles. Your dedication and devotion to creating a fun and safe environment for our children is appreciated.

Highlights of the Year

- 100% of our teams from Mite through Bantam were run by fully certified coaches and trainers. MMHA is the only minor hockey association in the City of Markham to provide a certified trainer on every bench.
- MMHA ran a ten-week session of player development clinics—from October through January at a cost of \$95 per session. We accommodated over 50 house league players.

Floorball

In the spring of 2013, we moved our spring floorball league to the beautiful, new Cornell Community Centre. The ten-week league was played on hardwood in the new triple gym. One hundred twenty six registered players played on 10 teams: 4 Novice/Atom teams, 4 Peewee teams, and 2 Bantam/Midget teams.

Tony Roman Memorial Hockey Celebration

MMHA hosted the annual Tony Roman Memorial Hockey Celebration in its new format. On Saturday, MMHA players enjoyed a skills competition similar to those held at the NHL All Star game. On Sunday players were provided an "NHL game experience" in which players were introduced before the game, *O Canada* was sung, and music and commentary were provided throughout the game.



VP/GM AA/A/AE Report

During the 2013-2014 season 22 of a possible 27 teams were iced. We continue to face challenges in the 1996/97 (Midget) and 1998 (Minor Midget) age groups where only AA teams were iced. In the 1999 and younger age groups we have been successful in icing full AA/A/AE programs, except in the 2000 age group (Minor Bantam), which did not have an AE team. We continue to see a drop off in rep hockey starting in the Minor Bantam years as players enter high school and the find it challenging to balance the commitment of rep sports with school and part time work. In addition, more players are choosing the noncontact and lesser commitment requirement option of playing in the Rostered Select program.

This was our most successful season in the OMHA Playdowns in recent years. The Minor Atom AA and Bantam AA teams reached the OMHA semi-finals, while the Atom AA and Novice AE teams were OMHA Finalists. The Minor Bantam A and Minor Peewee AA were York-Simcoe Finalists.

Our AAA Zone is proud to use the name Waxers and to be considered a part of the "family" but just a reminder that our home boundaries are different than those of the AA/A/AE and House League organization. We are recognized and treated as a separate organization in the eyes of the OMHA and OHF.

We believe that we had another successful season for no other reason than we were able to provide a welcoming place for players to play hockey and for them to acquire more knowledge on working in a team environment.

A Season Synopsis

- 9 AAA teams from Novice through Midget
- 156 players registered to the teams
- 54 Coaching staff members registered
- Approximately 650 games played between exhibition, league, tournaments and playoffs
- The 9 teams combined for a 146-116-36 league record
- Our Major Midget team hosted the week long Ontario Central Region Telus Cup Championships. Thanks to the parent group for a very well-run event. Markham Centennial Arena had over 1,000 people in attendance for one of the round robin games!! The team played well but lost out in the semi-final.
- Our Major Midget team made it to the OMHA Championship weekend and won the Bronze medal.
- Our Minor Bantam and Novice teams won their respective ETA Playoff Championships while our Major Atom team were ETA finalists
- Our Major Peewee team won the Gold medal at OMHA Championship / won the North American Silver Stick Championship and the Silver medal at the All-Ontario Championships
- Ilir Mehmeti, Head Coach of our Minor Bantam team, was our AAA Coach of the Year.
- We had three players selected from our Minor Midget team in the recent OHL Draft.

Players' Banquet



Approximately 125 guests attended the dinner and the caterer is sure he served about 150 plates of food again this year!


Instead of a guest speaker for the evening, we again booked a big screen TV so everyone could watch the NHL playoffs.

The Hockey Development Program (HDP) operates and encompasses the Coach Mentorship Program and the Player Development Program. The mission of the HDP is to provide the

support and resources necessary to aid in the successful development and continued learning of all of our coaches and players as members of the Markham Minor Hockey Association. The HDP runs under the direction of the HDP director, Michael Gouglas, appointed by the Markham Waxers Executive. The director oversees all aspects related to the program and communicates these operations to the Executive. The HDP consists of Coach Mentors, Instructors, and Volunteers.

The HDP works in partnership with the Ontario Minor Hockey Association and Hockey Canada. Whenever possible, the HDP uses resources and programs available through these governing bodies and executes them at the local level.

Highlights of the 2013/2014 Season

- Over 200 Players registered for both the player and goaltending clinics.
- 38 Goalies registered for McGuire's goaltending training.
- Feedback on the coaching seminars, coach mentorship program, and skill development programs was very positive again.

Coach Mentorship Program

The Hockey Development program presented four Coach Seminars.



Referee Report

Referee Highlights

- During the 2013-2014 Markham supplied Officials for 1,460 games.
- There were 509 House Leagues games with teams from Tyke to Juvenile.
- At the Rep and Select levels, our officials worked in 860 games. This includes exhibition, regular season, and playoff games.
- During the playoffs 53 of our home games were covered by "Out of Town" officials. Markham officials covered 81 games at other centres during playoffs.
- Markham also supplied officials for 126 Tournament games.

Referee Development

- The 2013/2014 season saw the implementation of a four official system for all Minor Midget AAA and Midget AAA games.
- Markham and Stouffville Minor Hockey hosted an OMHA entry level referee clinic in October 2013. There were 30 new officials invited to attend. From this clinic Markham received five young officials and two adults. They all worked in our House League division.
- We will be hosting another entry level clinic this fall for new officials.

Timekeeper Scheduler's Report

During the 2013-14 hockey season, timekeepers were provided for over 1,200 games ranging from exhibition, tournament, and regular season games to playoffs. Teams covered included house league (Peewee to Juvenile), Select, and Rep. Timekeepers were also provided for the Midget AAA Telus Cup and the Minor Peewee AA Tournament.

This season's roster was comprised of over 30 timekeepers. A mandatory OMHA classroom clinic was hosted by MMHA at the beginning of the season to ensure that all new timekeepers were adequately prepared. Live game training was also arranged following classroom instruction.

We expect to lose a few experienced timekeepers to university, they will be replaced prior to the beginning of next season. Timekeepers must be a minimum of 14 years old, or entering grade nine, and must show a strong work ethic.

Ice Scheduler's Report

During the 2013-2014 Hockey season, the Waxers and MMHA used a total of 154 hours of ice per week for the following:

- MMHA house league practices and games
- Waxers practices and games
- Development clinics

Additional ice at CanLan was provided as ice allocation to teams. Stouffville provided Saturday evening ice for Waxers AAA home games.

The team ice allocation was balanced to address all team requests prior to the season starting and allow AP players to be called up. During the year there was available ice to teams for extra practice or loss of practice due to playoffs.

Tryout schedule booked for 2013-2014 season was a success, as was the use of Stouffville Ice and Angus Glen during the tryouts.

2013-2014 Playoff Format

This was our second year with the new York Simcoe / OMHA Rep playoff format and favourable feedback was received by all associations. We will continue with new format and season extension in the 2014-2015 season.

In the upcoming 2014-2015 season there will be meetings held with ice schedulers and associations to review and possibly make adjustments to the playoff format if required.

Thank you to all the teams for another great season and looking forward in assisting all the coaches, managers and new staff members next season.

Head Trainer Report

The Waxers organization strongly suggested that all teams have their athletes baseline tested. In support of this request, the organization sent out an educational newsletter covering off the topics of concussion, baseline testing, and returns to play protocol. The organization also posted a short concussion education video on the home page of each team's website.

Approximately, 2/3 of teams baseline tested their athletes. These teams received a \$100.00 pizza gift card and were asked to show the HC/Parachute concussion educational film to their teams.

The feedback from the teams that participated in the program was very good. Parents commented that they were able to make more informed decisions regarding return to play after injury.

For the upcoming 2014-2015 season, the Waxers organization has made participation in the Konkussion program mandatory for all rep athletes.

In March, the Waxers organization participated in the York-Simcoe Minor Hockey Association safety survey. These results were presented the YSMHA meeting in April.

Planned Activities for the 2014-2015 Season

- Rollout of the all-inclusive concussion management program called Konkussion, provided through a local doctor and hockey parent Dr. Mike Poschar.
- Creating a home and away House League series with Stouffville Minor Hockey
- Feasibility study into running a year-end Waxers tournament
- We will be presenting a motion at the OMHA AGM in June to allow Minor Midget and Midget AAA teams the opportunity to use an extra five minutes of game time that otherwise usually goes unused.
