Financially, we managed well through the two pandemic years and the return to full programming this past season despite revenues/participants being down—in some cases significantly. This trend started just before COVID but is a real concern to all of us involved in minor hockey throughout Canada.

Here in Markham we were very fortunate to have a team lead by Darren Mori, Rich Brewda, and Al Nixon who began preparations in February to host "First Shift," a program designed to introduce hockey to new kids including full equipment and training sessions. The sessions are planned for an April launch and we thank all those involved for making this effort to bring new players into our sport!

Treasurer's Report

We have once again engaged the services of Lott & Company Professional Corporation to provide financial statements for the organization.

As an association – Rep and House League – we paid the administrator, ice scheduler, director of hockey development, coach mentors, chief referee, and timekeeper scheduler fees of \$81,222. Payments to the administrator, ice schedular, and timekeeper scheduler are split evenly between house league and rep. Payments to the director of hockey development and coach mentors are covered in rep team assessment fees.

As of March 31, 2023, the Markham Waxers House League fund balance was \$286,910.

Revenue increased slightly due to an increase in registrations as more families were comfortable in returning to hockey after the pandemic. In an effort to keep hockey affordable, registration fees were kept flat despite the anticipated increase in ice costs.

Expenses increased primarily due to a 7.8% increase in the hourly rate at City of Markham rinks and an increase in insurance fees.

As of March 31, 2023, the Markham Waxers fund balance is \$423,046.

Due to the anticipated increase in the City of Markham's ice rate, assessment fees were raised \$3,000 per team (approximately \$175/player). Revenue increased due to an increase in assessment fees and icing two additional teams over the previous year.

Expenses increases were due primarily to a 7.8% increase in the cost of Markham ice, a 5.9% increase in the cost of jerseys, and an increase in insurance fees.

Hockey Development Report

The Hockey Development Program (HDP) operates and encompasses the Coach Mentorship Program and the Player Development Program. The mission of the HDP is to provide the support and resources necessary to aid in the successful development and continued learning of all of our coaches and players as members of the Markham Minor Hockey Association. The HDP runs under the direction of the HDP director, Michael Gouglas, appointed by the Markham Waxers Executive. The director oversees all aspects related to the program and communicates these operations to the Executive. The HDP consists of coach mentors, instructors, and volunteers.

The HDP works in partnership with the Ontario Minor Hockey Association and Hockey Canada. Whenever possible, the HDP uses resources and programs available through these governing bodies executing them at the local level.

Highlights of the 2022-2023 Season

- The Hockey Development Program returned to normal.
- Players and Goalie Clinics were held in April, Fall and Winter.
- Development Skates were held prior to the tryouts seasons for the appropriate age groups.

Referee Report

The 2022/2023 hockey season was the first full season of hockey following COVID. Many officials did not return making it challenging to supply the full complement of officials each games. We did however supply officials for 755 Representative league and exhibition games and another 525 House League games.

Timekeeper Scheduler's Report

The past hockey season was quite challenging from many perspectives. Many who had been timekeepers chose not to return, resulting in mostly new minor officials. We were able to supply timekeepers for over 700 rep and exhibition games, and all house league games where timekeeping was required.

Ice Scheduler's Report

The Waxers used a total of 186.5 hours of ice per week for the following:

- House league practices and games
- Rep (AAA, AA, A, BB and MD) practices and games
- Select Program
- Minor Development program
- Development clinics

Additional ice at CanLan Ice Sports in Scarborough was purchased and used as practice ice for teams.

The team ice allocation was balanced prior to the season to address all team requests and to allow the participation of AP players with their affiliated teams. During the year ice was made available to teams for extra practice or to replace a lost practice due to playoffs.

Tryout ice booked for 2022-2023 season was a success. Tryouts were held at Centennial and Angus Glen.

Playoff Format

As each season progresses, ice schedulers and representatives from other associations continue discussions with playoff formats to adjust any issues that may arise with the approval of the York Simcoe Minor Hockey League (YSMHL) and Ontario Minor Hockey Association (OMHA). The OMHA has advised that all 2022-2023 teams will play in the OMHA playoffs regardless of the standings from the season. This will give each team to participate in the OMHA's.

Meetings are held with ice schedulers to review and provide recommendations to adjust the playoff format as required.

Thank you to all the teams for another great season and looking forward in assisting all the coaches, managers, and new staff member's next season.

Waxers Organization and Team Websites

The Waxers continue to provide an integrated club website. The website hosts each team's individual site that provides all team information. The organization website is the main location to review upcoming and new events that take place within the organization. As ice scheduler for the Waxers, the major benefit of the website is the integration of all schedule changes that occur from TheOneDB, which is linked to other associations. Ice schedulers can see each other's schedule and assist each other when rescheduling home and away games.

Here are a few of the most important features of the website.

- Fully integrated team websites
- Web-based site maintenance that can be shared amongst authorized people in our association.
- Fully integrated scheduling by our ice scheduler
- Automatic email and/or text message notification with schedule changes, game results, and more
- Social network integration such as auto-tweeting news articles to Twitter[™]
- Password-protection of pages managed by the team webmasters
- Automatic archiving of previous seasons
- Mobile and tablet access is now available for team managers to manage and update their team website.
- Parents with VIEW access only can see their team schedules and receive updates when changes occur.
- *NEW*: Sportsheadz has developed an APP for IOS and Android that will allow teams to sign up for real time updates and schedules.

• Sportsheadz continues to enhance the functionality of the website to ensure all teams are up to date with details and managing their own team website.

Head Trainer Report

The Markham Waxers organization continued to use the Holland Bloorview Kids Rehabilitation Hospital (HB) concussion program.

Our policies and procedures were reviewed by Stephanie McFarland (OT for Concussion program) to ensure they reflect updated research regarding concussion and any further recommendations in accordance with "Rowans Law." Annual education will continue to take place for team trainers' this season. The annual cost for these services for the 2022-2023 season was \$4,500 (+GST).

Players who suffer a concussion during the year have access to the Holland Bloorview's early concussion care program with the fees being billed to and covered by the Waxers Organization. The cost of treatment varies depending on the players needs but is approximately (\$200-375).

Trainers were asked to report when a player is removed from play with a suspected concussion, and to report any other injuries sustained by players. Once reported, guidance was given regarding the proper RTP protocols when needed.
