HOCKEY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

The Hockey Development Program will operate and encompass both the Coach Mentorship Program, and the Player Development Program within the Markham Waxers Minor Hockey Association.

The mission of the Hockey Development Program is to provide the support and resources necessary in order to aid in the successful development and continued learning of all of our coaches and players as members of the Markham Waxers Minor Hockey Association.

The Hockey Development Program will run under the direction of a director appointed by the Markham Waxers Executive Committee. It will be the duty of the director to oversee all aspects related to the program and communicate these operations to the Markham Waxers Executive Committee.

The Markham Waxers Executive Committee will set the budget for the Hockey Development Program. It will be the responsibility of the Director to use this allocated amount accordingly in managing and operating the Hockey Development Program.

The Hockey Development Program will work in partnership with the Ontario Minor Hockey Association and Hockey Canada. Whenever possible, the Markham Waxers Hockey Development Program will use resources and programs available through these governing bodies and execute them at the local level.

The Hockey Development Program will consist of Coach Mentors, Instructors, and Volunteers.

The Hockey Development Program will promote and operate within the set philosophies and mission of the Markham Waxers Minor Hockey Association.





MISSION STATEMENT

The Markham Waxers Hockey Development Program will endeavor to provide all association members, both coaches and players, with the support and resources necessary to aid in their development and enrich their minor hockey experience.









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INTRODUCTION

Starting with the 2010 – 2011 hockey season, Markham Waxers Minor Hockey will be operating a Hockey Development Program to help aid in the development of all our minor hockey coaches and players.

The Markham Waxers Hockey Development Program (MWHDP) will encompass two separate programs, the Coach Mentorship Program and the Player Development Program.

For everyone who is involved in minor hockey in Markham, this program has been designed for them to help insure the proper support, tools, and resources are available as they progress through their development in minor hockey.

We hope that with their support and utilization of this program, minor hockey in Markham will reach a strengthened level of development as it relates to the support and resources being made available to everyone in our association.





PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM

Over the past few hockey seasons, members of our association have made a growing request that there be additional levels of support and programs available to help them achieve higher levels of success throughout their hockey seasons. Understanding this need, Markham Waxers Minor Hockey has developed under the control of a director, the Markham Waxers Hockey Development Program.

This program will grow to meet the needs of all our members while following the constitution set fourth by Markham Waxers Minor Hockey and its mission. In particular to organize, develop and promote minor ice hockey for the youth of the Town of Markham including Unionville and Thornhill. As well to continually strive to become an improved hockey organization exemplifying the standard for others to follow.

The Hockey Development Program will work in partnership with the Ontario Minor Hockey Association and Hockey Canada, following the guidelines and framework already available. Whenever possible, the Markham Waxers Hockey Development Program will use those resources and programs available through these governing bodies and execute them at the local level.

We hope that with the implementation of this program, we will see success in many areas, including and not limited to; higher coach recruitment/retention, an increase in players and parents believing in "community hockey", a higher promotion of players through AE-AAA, and an improved level of success and enjoyment of all our member teams, players, and coaches.







COACH MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

The purpose of the Coach Mentorship Program is to provide all coaches with the resources and support necessary to further develop their skills as minor hockey coaches.

All coaches within the Markham Waxers Hockey Association will have access to a designated Coach Mentor capable of providing the skills, knowledge, and support that may be required to help improve their coaching performance.

The Coach Mentorship Program will be offered complimentary at no-cost to all Markham Waxer Coaches.

It will be the goal of the Coach Mentorship Program to help strengthen our coaching body and foster an improved level of camaraderie between all of our minor hockey coaches.

COACH MENTORSHIP FORMAT

Through the Coach Mentorship Program, each Markham Waxer Minor Hockey Coach will have an assigned Mentor to work with for the duration of the hockey season.

For the older age groups, ONE Mentor will be assigned to both the minor and major age groups and their levels (Bantam-Midget). At the younger age groups (Novice-Peewee), the AAA coach will also be responsible for assisting the AA, A, and AE coaches in addition to the assigned Coach Mentors.

Coach Mentors will be responsible for scheduling appropriate meeting times and dates with all of their assigned coaches. Duties of the Coach Mentors will include working on-ice, and off-ice with their coaches, assisting with clinics, and being a reliable source of support and guidance for their coaches. Mentors will have the freedom to work with their assigned coaches on a mutually agreed schedule that works for all parties involved.





COACH MENTORSHIP FORMAT - GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

- Mentors will make contact with each of their coaches two (2) times a month (For Example One (1) Games, One (1) Practice). Some Mentors may be required to meet more often with a team or coach.
- Mentors will become familiar with the players and teams in their assigned age group. Keep notes, statistics, promote the AP process, etc.
- Mentors will be a valuable source of information to their coaches and will share whatever resources they can to help in the development of their coach.
- When requested to, Mentors can assist the head coach with the planning and running of team practices.
- Mentors will do their best to be available by phone and/or email to their coaches.

Waxers make moves to bolster coaching, player development

The Markham Waxers minor hockey organization wants hockey parents to know there's no place like home.

They are confident a program they've recently introduced will make a youngster's stay in Markham far more beneficial when it comes to their development.

Known as the Markham Waxers Hockey Development Program, the concept isn't just centred on players, Mike Gouglas, Waxers minor midget coach and director of hockey development for the Waxers organization, said.

Cooches, he said, will also reap the rewards.

Unveiling their program recently at Angus Glen Community Centre, just over 70 coaches representing the Waxers minor hockey association and neighbouring Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey were given free access to the one-day seminar.

"We had a great turnout. It went over quite well," Gouglas said.

The program encompassed two segments: coaching mentorship and player development.

During the recent get-together, the discussion centered primarily on coaching mentorship.

What this aspect centred on, Gouglas said, was in naming seven

coaching mentors with high local profiles. Each of the mentors, who are longtime coaches in Markham minor hockey or Markham area high schools, is assigned to a specific age group category.

Among the seven mentors are: Dan Daoust, who was also a former National Hockey League player; Ted Baker, Ontario Hockey League vice-president; Dave Turner, head coach at Brother Andre Catholic High School; Paul Titanic. Phil Kestin, lim Walker and John Ciaverella.

"We want our mentors to be familiar with our teams and we want them to create a support system," Gouglas said of the coaching mentorship program.

In addition, the program featured guest speakers Graham Wise, Ryerson University men's head hockey coach, who talked about planning for the upcoming hockey season; and Chris Mulchinock, owner of Markville Fitness who discussed strength and conditioning for young players.

Down the road, Gouglas said their plan will be to incorporate further coaching seminars, hopefully once a month with each pertaining to specific parts of the game to apply to their respective teams.

Gouglas said their player development program will involve Hockey Canada and Ontario Minor Hockey Association specific clinics focusing on specific skills.

The first will involve skating.

"Right now we're trying to get going with running skating lessons on weekends at the start of the year," he said.

Gouglas said he's been in contact with former Olympic figure skating performer and Canadian

Sports Hall of Fame member Paul Martini.

"We want to present an extra value added incentive to parents," Gouglas said of their organization's new program. "The cost will be lower than what parents are used to paying outside of Markham.


